

Uniform Titles in 240

Uniform titles are used for works that have title variations due to earlier works with a different title, or translations.

These are now indexed in the system. That means that if a t= search is done the 240 is retrieved.

240s do not verify unless the uniform title authority record is put into the system.

Uniform title authority records are rarely added to the system.

Ex. when a uniform title is used for a different title of the work.

100; 1 ;a Freemantle, Brian.

240; 10;a Button man.

245; 10;a In the name of a killer / \$c Brian Freemantle.

500; ;a Published in hardcover as The button man.

Ex. when a uniform title is used for a translation.

100; 1 ;a Sholem Aleichem, \$d 1859-1916.

240; 10;a Te vye der milkhiker. \$l English

245; 10;a Tevye the dairyman / \$c author, Sholem-Aleykhem.

The \$l in the 240 is the language of the item being cataloged, not the original language.

Nonfiling characters can remain in a 240 because the second indicator is for nonfiling characters.
